Facts and Stats Grade "B-" for February

According to Idaho Code 39-5701, the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare must inspect each business that sells tobacco to ensure that it does not sell tobacco to minors. In **February 2017**:

- 31 Vendors were inspected. *
- 5 Vendors sold to the inspecting minor.
- The compliance rate for the month was 83.87%

*Inspections where purchase attempts were made.

FDA Authorized Inspections on Vape Products & More

In case you missed this article last month, the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Deeming Rule went into effect on August 8, 2016. The rule extends the agency's regulatory authority to tobacco products to include electronic nicotine delivery systems (ENDS) such as e-cigarettes and vape pens; all cigars; hookah (waterpipe) and pipe tobacco; nicotine gels; and certain dissolvables. FDA inspections in Idaho now include these items, meaning the FDA Teen Inspectors will be trying to purchase these products. As with cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, loose tobacco, and tobacco papers these products are **not** to be sold to anyone under the age of 18 years old. Check a photo ID of anyone under the age of 27 who is attempting to purchase such products. Tobacco Laws Protect Minors

Under Idaho law it's illegal to sell tobacco to minors. This means anything that contains tobacco including cigarettes, tobacco, tobacco papers, snuff, cigars, electronic cigarettes, pipes, hookah and smokeless tobacco. If you sell to a minor, you could be fined \$100 and lose your job. Here are some reminders of state and federal laws that protect youth from buying tobacco products:

- 1. Retailers should check the photo ID of anyone purchasing tobacco projects. The FDA requires that everyone who looks younger than 27 must be carded.
- 2. Retailers should only sell cigarettes, cigarette tobacco, smokeless tobacco, e-cigs, cigars, and hookah tobacco to anyone 18 years or older.
- 3. Retailers should never break open cigarette or smokeless tobacco packages to sell products in smaller amounts.
- 4. Retailers should never sell cigarette packages containing fewer than 20 cigarettes.
- 5. Retailers should never sell single cigarettes, also called "loosies".
- 6. Retailers should never give away free samples of cigarettes.
- 7. Retailers should never give away free samples of smokeless tobacco except from a qualified, adult-only facility.
- 8. Retailers should never sell flavored cigarettes or flavored cigarette tobacco (other than menthol).

Idaho strongly encourages employers to train new employees on tobacco rules and laws before starting a new job and to also offer refresher training each year. In Idaho, both the clerk and the retailer are fined if the business does not pass a compliance check. So be sure you and your employees get the proper training. The information provided on the Prevent the Sale website will ensure you and your employees have all the information necessary to comply with Idaho's "Prevention of Minors' Access to Tobacco" law.
