2023 FACTS AND STATS

What was the Compliance Grade for state tobacco and electronic smoking device inspections?

Grade A for October 2023

According to Idaho Code 39-5701, the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare must inspect each Permitted Retailer that sells tobacco and electronic smoking devices to ensure that it does not sell these products to minors.

How well did these Permitted Retailers comply with the law in October 2023?

- 147 Permitted Retailers were inspected. *
- 4 Permitted Retailers sold to the inspecting minor.
- The compliance rate for October 2023 was:

97.28%

Idaho Tobacco Project's Resources Help Educate Retailers

The Idaho Department of Health and Welfare's <u>Idaho Tobacco Project</u> (ITP) and the <u>FDA</u> have resources available to Idaho Tobacco and Electronic Smoking Device Retailers that can assist in training employees on the proper and legal way to sell tobacco products and electronic smoking devices to customers over 21. These resources also assist Retailer's in understanding the legal requirements of selling these products to the public.

ITP's Employee Training Form

The ITP provides an <u>Employee Training Form</u> that all employees should read, initial, and sign. This form can be used as part of employee onboarding, as well as, an ongoing training tool. All clerks who sell tobacco products and electronic smoking devices to the public should be aware of the current laws regarding youth access to these products in Idaho. Retailers are encouraged to keep these Employee Training Forms with their employee records and use the form as part of the Retailer's annual refresher training activities.

Do your clerks understand the basics?

- State law prohibits the sale of ANY tobacco products or electronic smoking devices to persons under 21 years of age and that verification of age is required for any sale of tobacco products.
- Clerks should always ask for photo identification from any persons not personally known to be at least 21 years of age and verify their age before a sale of tobacco products or electronic smoking devices.
- Sales of tobacco products or electronic smoking devices to anyone under the age of 21 can result in a personal fine to the clerk of \$100 for the first offense.
- "Tobacco products or electronic smoking devices" includes any substance that contains tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether inhaled, absorbed, or ingested by any other means. These may include, but are not limited to the following: cigarettes, cigars, pipes, snuff, smoking or chewing tobacco, snus, tobacco papers, smokeless tobacco, any substance intended to be aerosolized or vaporized regardless of whether or not it contains nicotine, an electronic smoking device that may be used to deliver an aerosolized or vaporized substance, or any component of an electronic smoking device.
- The store may be inspected at any time for compliance with the state law regarding underage access to tobacco products and electronic smoking devices.
- All sales must be "vendor assisted" unless the store is exempt from this requirement and has 75% of the total merchandise available for sale as tobacco products or electronic smoking devices.
- Cigarettes must be sold only in their original sealed package from the manufacturer.

To get more detailed information, download a copy of the Idaho Code 39-5700 and keep a copy for your records.

Why do we provide these resources?

<u>Studies show</u> that nicotine addiction originates in adolescents with close to 90% of adult daily smokers starting before the age of 18. In addition, teens have been shown to be more susceptible to addiction. If we can prevent the sale of tobacco and electronic smoking devices to young people, we can prevent the health devastation that comes with long term use of these products.

Idaho is committed to preventing the sale of tobacco and electronic smoking devices to youth, which is the reason for the enforcement efforts and penalties when laws are ignored. Running a retail business is not always easy. So, during this season of gratitude and thanksgiving, the Idaho Tobacco Project says, "Thank you!" for your continued partnership in ensuring that no customer under 21 can purchase tobacco products or electronic smoking devices from your retail store.
