# Are You at Risk? Stopping the Sale of Tobacco to Minors

#### It's Time to Renew Your Permit!

#### Are You at Risk?

Are you at risk of selling tobacco to minors? Idaho businesses and their employees have been fined over \$59,000 dollars this year for selling tobacco to minors. Are your employees armed with the protection they need to prevent the sale of tobacco to minors?

Take these steps to prevent the sale of tobacco to minors and to avoid fines:

- 1. Train Employees. Be sure your employees know and understand that it's illegal to sell tobacco products to minors, that they can recognize Idaho's new drivers' license and ID cards, and know the rule "when it's green, stop the teen" (under 18) and "when it's red, use your head" (under 21).
- 2. Provide cash registers that calculate a customer's age. Using these cash registers can prevent the sale to minors.



- 3. Provide counter top calendars that specify the year before which customers must be born to legally purchase tobacco. These calendars and cards also remind minor customers that your employees will be monitoring the sale of tobacco.
- 4. Regularly supervise employees who sell tobacco products.
- 5. Have a clear policy. For example, some stores card everyone under 30, while others card everyone under 35. Providing employees with a clear policy outlining the store's position, procedures and consequences for selling to minors can avoid confusion and frustration when employees are confronted with minors who wish to buy tobacco.

### **Factoids and Statistics**

#### "B+" Average for October

According to Idaho Code 39-5701 the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare must inspect each business that sells tobacco to ensure that it does not sell tobacco to minors. For October of 2002:

- ♦ 230 Vendors were inspected. \*
- ♦ 32 Vendors sold to the inspecting minor.
- ◆ The compliance rate for the month of October 2002 was 86%.
