### Can you Spot a Fake Driver's License?

#### **Facts and Stats**

#### "B" Average for April

According to Idaho Code 39-5701 the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare must inspect each business that sells tobacco to ensure that it does not sell tobacco to minors. In April 2006:

- 365 Vendors were inspected.\*
- 50 Vendors sold to the inspecting minor.
- The compliance rate for the month of April 2006 was 86%

\*Inspections where purchase attempts were made.

## Practice Identifying Drivers' Licenses

If an Idaho driver's license is stamped "under 18" and the photograph is framed in green, do not sell tobacco to this person. If it is stamped "under 21" and the photograph is framed in red, that person can purchase tobacco, but not alcohol. It's also good to know what other state driver's licenses look like, so try to familiarize yourself with a few states that are close by, like Washington, Oregon, Montana, and Utah.

It's also a good idea to practice identifying fake IDs. Here are some characteristics to watch for:

- Check the size, thickness, and color
- Check the photograph for shading, glare, or "red-eye"
- Check the state seal for accuracy
- Check the back for blurred or dark images
- Check for such phrases as "for personal use,"
   "office use only," or "not a government document."
- Check the placement, size, and typeface of the letters and numbers
